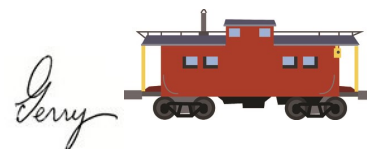

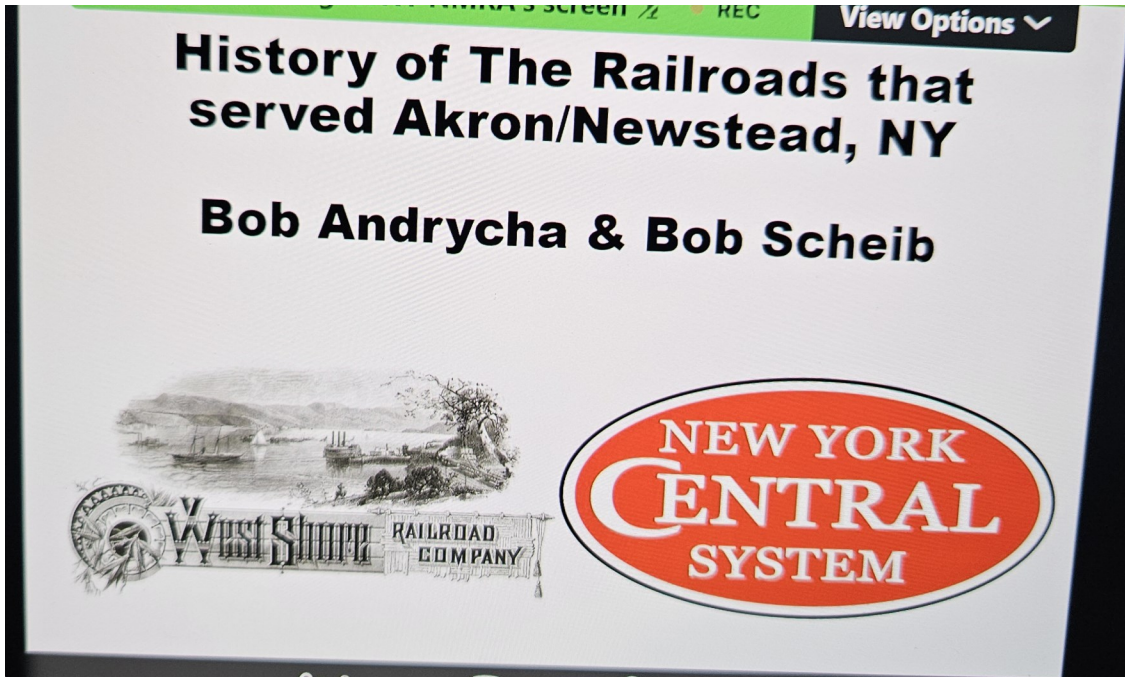

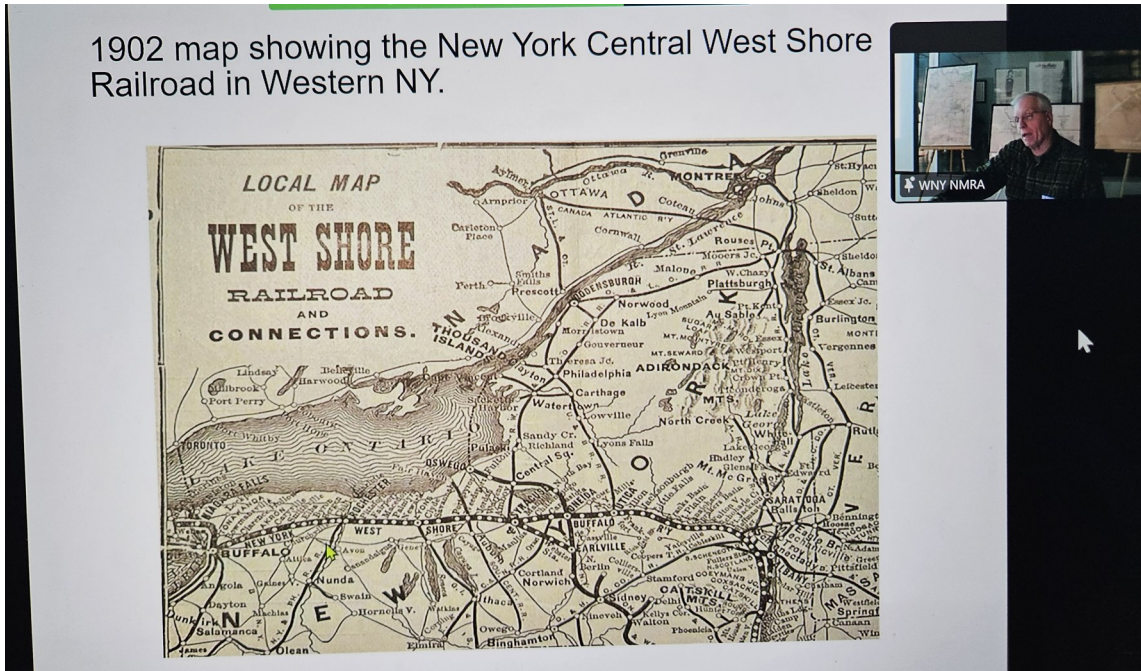


January 18, 2025 - Division Mtg. at Heritage Discovery Center

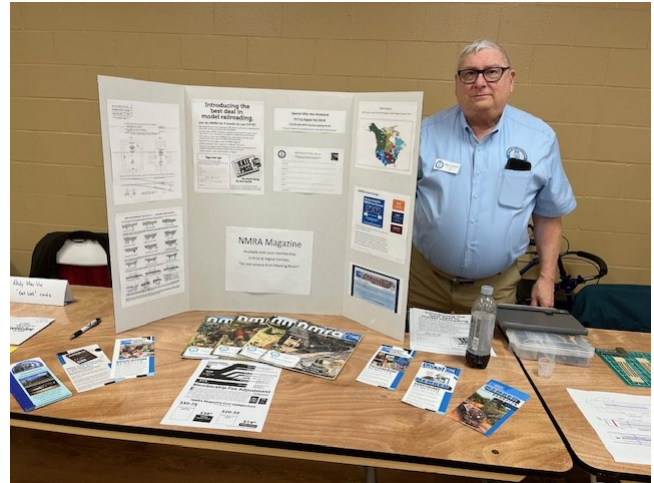
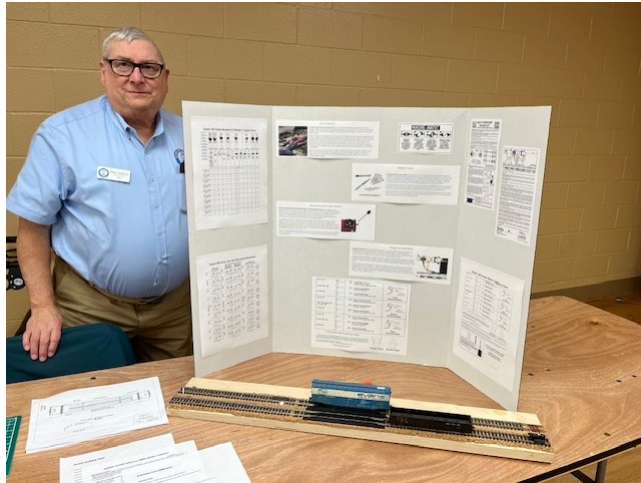

AP REPORT

Previously, Gary Reynolds, MMR, our AP Manager, shared the latest on the NMRA's Achievement Program Association Volunteer Certificate.

I'd like to take this opportunity to discuss the Achievement Program (AP) Association Volunteer Certificate. Our division has awarded this certificate to several of our members over the past year. I also know that a few members would qualify or are coming close to qualifying once they complete the required paperwork.

I have one big piece of advice for anyone who plans to apply for an AP certificate. Please read the requirements on the NMRA website and please do not overthink or interpret what it says.

All that being said, I will try to review the requirements for you. I have eliminated all the requirements that I feel do not apply in most cases (national and regional work).

To qualify for the Association Volunteer certificate, you must accumulate sixty (60) certified time units (TUs). The TUs you receive for various types of service are listed below:

- Active as a Division Officer or Committee Manager - **1 TU per month**
- Active satisfactory service as a Division Committee or Board Member - **½ TU per month**

So, what exactly constitutes a "committee"? Basically, just about any office or function except Divisional Superintendent (this is covered under Association Official). Most other officers in a Division are considered Committee Chairmen.

- Service as a Division Officer or Director (other than at the Regional level) - **1 TU per month**
- Newsletter Editors - **1 TU per month (all newsletters must have at least 4 issues per year)**
- Official judges at NMRA sponsored model contests (including non-rail) shall be given time units for such service at the contest only (not monthly), as a one-time service credit per contest as follows: Division Contest Judge - **1 Time Unit**
- Individuals (and their crews) who open their home or club layout for layout tours in conjunction with NMRA conventions or other NMRA sponsored events earn credit as follows for each day the layout is open for viewing:

Regional Event - 3 Time Units/day (6 TUs maximum per event)

Divisional Event - 3 Time Units/day (3 TUs maximum per event)

- A live clinic that is presented more than once earns Association Volunteer credits for each additional (the first presentation is credited toward Author) presentation at the following schedule: Divisional Clinic - **1 Time Unit**

You are required to complete a Record of Service (see sample form on next page) to track all of your hours. This may sound challenging, but you will be surprised how the hours add up. Remember your AP Chairman, that's me, is here to help!

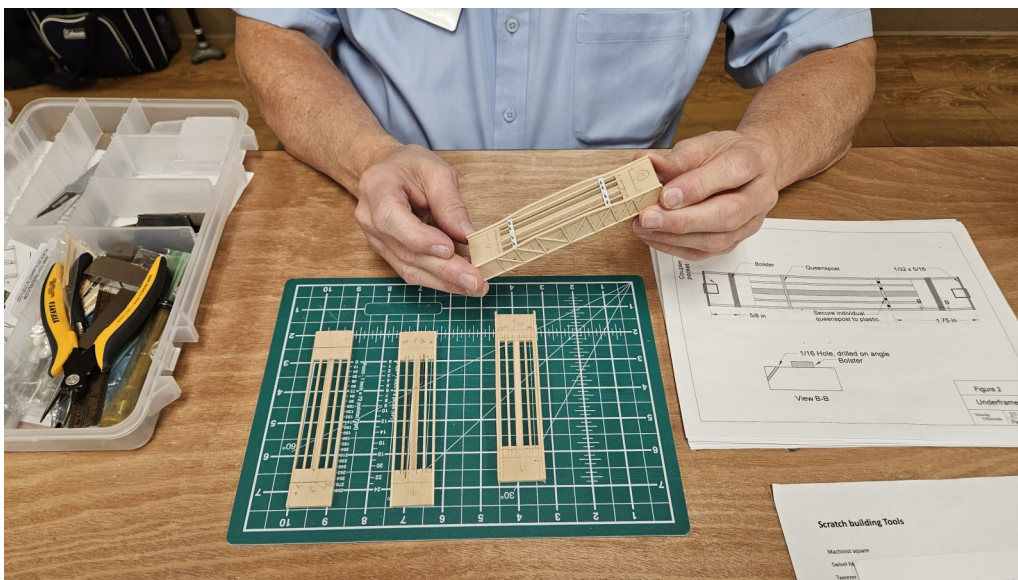
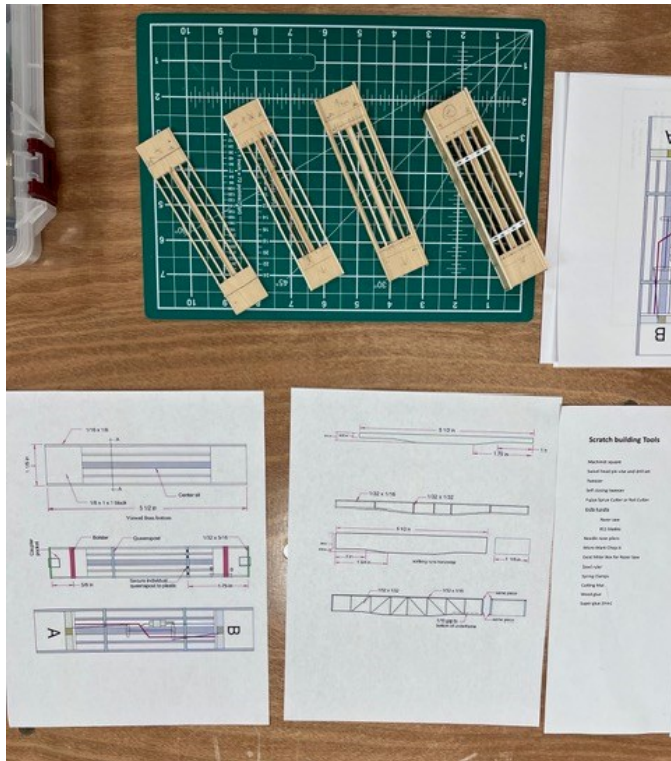
AP REPORT

In this issue's *What's On Your Workbench*, Assistant Superintendent Steve Cotton shares his workbench with us. Thank you Steve!

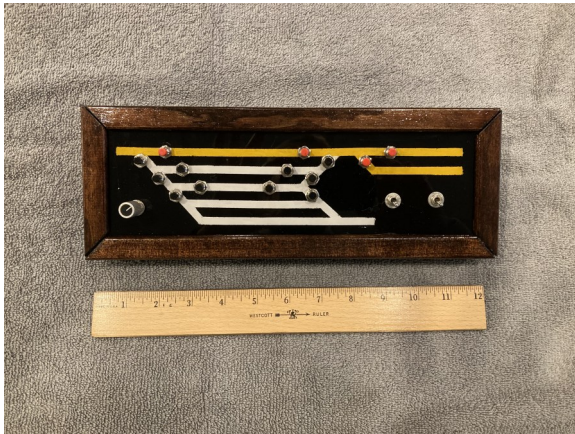

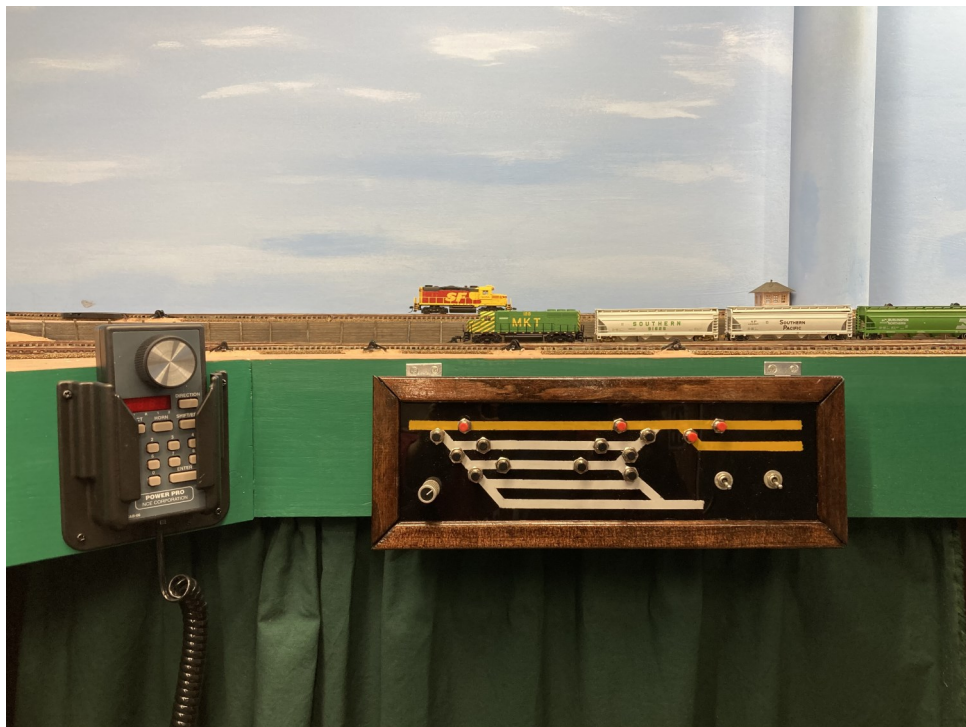

End of the tracks for locomotive engineer Neal Keirn

Participates in last run after 18 years on the job

MIDDLEPORT — Neal Keirn began his dream job with the Falls Road Railroad on Jan. 17, 2007, and 18 years to the day later, he climbed into engine #2035 for the last time.

Keirn has had a passionate infatuation with the railroad since he was a little boy, growing up across from the tracks in Middleport.

"As a kid, I hung around the railroad," Keirn said. "I'd be watching them switch cars and the engineer would let me climb in the engine with him. I got the idea that would be a fun thing to do."

As he grew older and reached his teens, he began to understand how the railroad worked and about becoming an engineer.

"But in the mid-1970s, Penn Central had gone bankrupt, four other railroads that served the area went bankrupt and the other railroads

Henn, museum board member and head conductor on train excursions, has meant the world to Keirn, he said.

"I tried very hard to do a good job, starting slowly and stopping smoothly with all the young passengers," Keirn said. "It was very rewarding to hear I was doing my best."

"We can always tell when you're running the train," Henn once told Keirn.

For 10 years, Keirn has trained locomotive engineers and numerous conductors, in which he took a lot of pride, he said.

The only downside to his job has been four incidents at grade crossings, Keirn said, none of which were his fault. Two occurred on Hulberton Road; another was when a woman skidded onto the tracks in Batavia on a snowy day; and another last June when a truck stalled on the tracks on Fancher Road. Fortunately, none of the incidents resulted in any serious injuries.

Keirn is married to the former Roberta "Gilly" Blount of Medina and they have two daughters.

Last July Keirn turned 67
